**AUSTAR for schools and Nat Geo Wild's animal expert Ben Britton to visit Ballarat**

AUSTAR for schools is excited to announce that Nat Geo Wild's animal expert Ben Britton will be travelling to Ballarat as part of the AUSTAR for schools Wild Animal Encounters Month.

Ben will be hosting native animal workshops on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> June for lucky students at Pleasant Street Primary School between 9.30am – 11.30am.

Ben will feature native Australian animals including crocodiles, native mammals, pythons, birds and lizards live in the classroom. Students will explore biological characteristics of the different animal groups, and will have the chance to touch and hold a variety of native Australian reptiles whilst learning about these fascinating animals.

This is the first year that Ben has been involved in the AUSTAR for schools program and Ben is looking forward to visiting schools in Victoria as part of Wild Animal Encounters Month.

Upon completion of each school visit AUSTAR for schools will present \$2000 to the participating school to be used for educational resources for the students.

The program also includes exciting extracurricular activities with AUSTAR personalities visiting schools across the country helping to inspire students and further bring education to life as well as making learning fun.
